LFR Fire & Life Safety Inspections

The Lyndon Fire & Rescue (LFR) conducts fire and life safety inspections annually, as required by law. Fees for inspection and permits are set by ordinance and based on square footage or the number of apartment / condo units. Most requires permits are included with the inspection fee.

LFR personnel can be identified by their uniforms and vehicles. They wear uniforms with a badge and LFR shoulder patches that say "Lyndon Fire & Rescue" and drive vehicles displaying the LFR's seal on each side of the vehicle. Inspection personnel will also have picture a ID.

We do not use private companies to inspect businesses and we do not repair, perform maintenance, or replace equipment. Our firefighters and inspectors only provide fire safety inspections and advice. An inspection violation report or compliance letter and invoice will be e-mailed or mailed at the conclusion of the inspection. We do utilize a third party company, Fire Recovery USA, for all accounts receivable invoicing and collection. Your invoice and permit will come to you thru them.

If you need your fire protection equipment serviced (fire extinguishers, fire sprinkler system, cooking hood system, fire alarm, etc.) it is recommended that business owners get a written agreement from a reputable fire protection service company before work begins. To help in identifying qualified workers, require them to do the following *BEFORE* you consider retaining their services:

1. Do a background check on the fire inspection company.
2. Ask what the fire inspection will include and how much it will cost before the inspection starts.
3. If you are hiring them to service or repair the fire sprinkler system, fire alarm system, request to see their Kentucky State Fire Marshal license.
4. If you are hiring them to perform electrical work or repairs, request to see their Electrician's license.
5. Request the inspector to leave any defective parts that they replaced or changed.

6. Request a signed invoice.
